On September 29th, from 4 pm to 7 pm, the largest capital project in Aspire's nearly 70-year history was unveiled to the public. Parents, friends, supporters, and assembled dignitaries toured the renovated and expanded CFL.

This environmental upgrade ensures that all of our students can learn and thrive in a consistently comfortable environment.

Aspire of WNY Assimilates SKIP of NY's Service Coordination

n September, Aspire of WNY entered into a collaboration to assume all of the Service Coordination for individuals and families receiving services through SKIP of NY. SKIP is a New York Citybased agency with five offices throughout New York State, including the Buffalo office. Locally, SKIP provided OPWDD service coordination for over 230 individuals. The collaboration with Aspire effectively ends SKIP's role as a service coordinator locally. However, the agency will continue providing care-at-home services.

Aspire recruited, interviewed and hired six Medicaid Service Coordinators (MSC) and one Supervisor, who were working for SKIP service coordination. Each of these SKIP employees came to Aspire as quality providers with an excellent track record of service to those they have supported.

"In this day and age, more agencies are exploring collaborations like this," explained Tom SY, President and CEO for Aspire of WNY. "We are thrilled to expand our opportunities to support more individuals, and because our MSC operation is so well run, we were confident that we could take on this additional work and provide a seamless transition for the SKIP clients."

As the transition was announced, Aspire held informational sessions for the SKIP families informing them about the breadth of services that Aspire provides. These meetings served to alleviate any concerns that SKIP families may have had and, in effect, turned the transition into a positive experience for them.

"I am really proud of how well our MSC team and the new staff handled the transition," stated Mary Anne Coombe, Aspire's VP of Service Coordination and Fiscal Mgt Services. "We welcomed them with open arms and they very quickly adjusted to our processes and procedures."
