Discover Technology Today

Do you know about Aspire's Technology Today program? Technology Today Tonawanda offers student transitional services designed to aid them in a seamless transition from high school to college or adult life.

Technology Today services include:

- Socializing Activities – Students are encouraged to participate in group activities with their peers to enhance socialization skills.
- Assistance with Homework or Projects
- Structured Day services that follow and aid students in accomplishing the goals as set through their school districts. These Day services can include:
 - A comprehensive evaluation to determine whether a student can benefit from assistive technology.
 - Determining the types of assistive equipment that would work best with a student's learning style.
 - Teaching students how to use and get the most out of adaptive equipment and software. For example, Google Voice Type, Microsoft Voice Recognition, Read&Write, OneNote graphic organizer, and LiveScribe pen.
 - Students are taught techniques that will assist them in achieving success in their next stage of life after high school.
